Your long letter to Mr Fels of the 23rd inst is only to hand this morning.

I happen to know that Mr Fels is greatly disappointed at the split between the two factions in Denmark; and he is not likely to take much interest in your country until there is some kind of unity. Mr Fels (who is now touring America on Single-tax propaganda) is exceedingly busy, and it seems to me that to send him your letter would be simply to worry him further. He feels very keenly the position of things among Henry George followers in Denmark at the present time; and, as no good purpose can be served by sending him your letter, I am not sending it to him. He can read it here on his return to England.
